WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOMS...

PRE-SCHOOL: This year, the preschoolers were busy learning their numbers, colors, shapes, and letters. They also practiced writing their names, drawing lines & shapes, sorting various items based on 2-3 attributes, measuring, and exploring many topics. This past month the preschool students completed their Recycling Study and began a study of bugs. They completed a study on 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and thoroughly examined the life cycle of a butterfly. Each preschool classroom raised caterpillars and observed



them grow and change into beautiful butterflies! They also learned about various bugs and insects and explored the unique characteristics of bugs vs. insects. To wrap up the school year, the students will complete an interactive exploration of balls. They will learn about various sports and activities that involve balls and conduct experiments to observe which balls roll and bounce. This was such a fun and exciting year filled with so many GREAT learning experiences!

KINDERGARTEN: Kindergarten has really enjoyed writing during our nonfiction "How-To" unit and sharing all our knowledge! We have been reading and writing informational texts and learned a lot of new information, especially about honey bees. Did you know a honey bee has 5 eyes?! In math, we focused on the topics of measuring and sorting. We also enjoyed Field Day - the kindergarteners did a great job problem solving, persevering and working as a team while participating in the activities! In June, we're looking forward to our field trip to the zoo, our Learning Celebration, and class picnic!

FIRST GRADE: It is hard to believe we are in the last few weeks of first grade! Our fantastic first graders are finishing up a year where they have grown in so many ways. In math, we have completed our unit on shapes (Geometry), learning about 2-D and 3-D shapes and all their attributes (ask your first grader what that word means!) In reading, we have been taking a closer look at characters and adventures in fiction. We have published our realistic fiction stories (or writing a book series) and are currently writing opinion pieces. We are eagerly awaiting the arrival of our Flat Stanley's. This will give us the opportunity to learn about map skills and geography, make presentations to our class, and for our classmates to generate questions. We are looking forward to our Writing Celebration on Thursday, June 6th from 12:50-1:30 and for our class picnic on June 18. Please continue to have your child read and practice math facts over the summer. It will help them with their transition into second grade. Have a wonderful and safe summer!

SECOND GRADE: May was an exciting time in second grade. All second graders started to learn about the plant life cycle by planting Brassica Fast Plant seeds and observing its 42 day life cycle. Students continue to wonder on a daily basis what will happen next in their plant's life cycle. In Writing Workshop, students wrote persuasive letters to other readers sharing opinions about their favorite characters in books. They learned how to form an opinion and support that opinion with strong reasons, evidence and examples. June will be just as exciting as we get ready for our Math learning celebration on June 7, followed by the end of year second grade picnic on June 12. As our students relax over the summer, there are still a few activities that would be beneficial to engage in during the break from school. Keeping a summer journal and reading daily is a great way to maintain reading and writing skills. Additionally, practice of addition and subtraction facts will help maintain fact fluency.

THIRD GRADE: Third graders continue to work hard as they come to the end of the school year and their time at Milton Avenue School. They are busy participating in research clubs during reading workshop and becoming experts on new non fiction topics. In math, third graders are continuing to practice multiplication strategies by working with multiples of 10 and then using greater numbers to solve real life word problems using all four operations: addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. The students were excited to welcome Mrs. Russo, Lafayette Avenue School principal, to Milton Avenue School at the end of the month and listen to her share the routines and programs of fourth grade. We will follow up in June with a visit ourselves to LAF, meet our 4th grade



buddies and tour the building. Third graders are also preparing to welcome family members to our Math Learning Celebration. One of our last technology projects will be a PowerPoint presentation all about a 3rd grader. The students will then present their project to second graders during Move Up Day. The science concepts of habitats and traits will conclude with the field trip to the Meadowlands Environmental Center. The students will explore the estuary and get hands on experiences with a scavenger hunt and a trip to the waterfront. The year will come to a close as the students enjoy their very special picnic at

Minisink, thanks to the Third Grade Spirit committee and all the parent volunteers.

EMERGENCY MEDICATIONS FOR NEXT YEAR: If your child requires that emergency medications be on hand while they are in school, such as an Epipen and/or a rescue inhaler, you will need to submit updated doctor's orders and the prescribed medications PRIOR to the beginning of the new school year. **For Medication meetings at MAS**, please stop by the Milton Avenue School Health Office between 9am and 2pm on Thursday, Aug 22nd, Monday, Aug 26th or Thursday, Aug 29th.

If your child currently has medication in the health office, please stop by to collect it on the last day of school. Medications **cannot** be left in the cabinet over the summer months and must be discarded if not collected. All medications must be collected by a responsible adult and will not be sent home with your children in their backpack.

First Grade: Students have discussed summer safety during recreational activities. We talked about how to stay safe at the pool, hiking, bike riding, and playing various sports! We discussed developing an awareness of potential hazards to personal health and safety.

Second Grade and Third Grade We covered sun and water safety; a timely topic for this time of year. The students understand the importance of getting shade, using sunscreen, and staying hydrated. Some important concepts that we learned regarding water safety were: wearing a lifejacket on a boat, swimming with a buddy in a supervised setting, knowing your limits, knowing where it is and isn't safe to dive head first, and many other practical concepts. This is a topic that I review every year, and is something the students can apply to their everyday lives.



Childhood experiences that contribute to a healthy self esteem include being spoken to respectfully and listened to, being given deserved affection and attention, and having achievements, as well as failures ,adequately acknowledged. After a group discussion about qualities we admire in ourselves, we read a book called "I'm Gonna Like Me" by Jamie Lee Curtis and "I Like Myself" by Karen Beaumont.

The class participated in various activities in which we made crafts such as bookmarks, self portraits and bracelets using some words to describe what they love about themselves. In addition, I gifted each classroom with a "YOU ARE" jar, which is a jar with positive affirmations!

<u>First Grade—</u> Biomimicry Design Challenge—Students designed and constructed their own "invention" to solve a problem that humans may have. Their invention was inspired by, or mimicked, an animal adaptation they learned about in their research.

<u>Second Grade</u>—Erosion Prevention Design Challenge—Students are in the middle of testing and evaluating their erosion prevention solutions. We have created a model of a beach that simulates waves going in and out of the shore. Students are observing and critiquing their designs based on how much their design prevents sand from going out with the tide.







<u>Third Grade</u>—Human Impact Research Project—Students are now finishing up their human impact presentations and getting ready to present them to their classmates. They have done impressive research and have done a great job showing off their technology skills.

First Grade has learned another note – La! We use these notes – Mi, So, and La – to read our singing game songs on the music staff. We are also learning about dynamics (piano and forte) with a fun game called "Lucy Locket."

Second Grade has learned the notes of the pentatonic scale – Do, Re, Mi, So, and La. We are reviewing dynamics learned in 1st Grade (piano and forte) and learned some new dynamics (pianissimo and fortissimo) with a fun game called "Black Snake."

Third Grade has been busy learning about the musical alphabet and beginning to play recorders! They will learn three notes on recorders and play several songs together in Music. This is a great beginning for those interested in learning Band or Orchestra instruments in 4th Grade!
