I began the year by visiting each of the classrooms in the month of September to do a mini lesson and activity about the role of a school counselor. HELLO ALL! I am looking forward to a new and exciting year of art creation with the first, second and third graders! The young artists are off to a great start, learning new skills while making worthwhile connections with a variety of subject matter.

First grade is learning about Elements of Art, like shape, line, and color. Students were given the task of shapes to create pictures inspired by Paul Klee's "Castle and Sun. 1928"

Second graders are working on "Name Art." They were given the task of using their names to create an abstract piece, where they colored in shapes created by the spaces around their letters. We made connections also to Paul Klee who is known for creating abstract pieces using among other things letters.

Third grade is learning about "Radial Symmetry," building off their understanding of symmetry learned in previous years. For this project they learn how to create a design that will mirror itself on all corners of the paper, creating a unified and balanced artwork that appears to "radiate" from the center of a folded paper. The work so far is quite stunning. We will finish off the work tracing in sharpie and coloring with markers.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE CLASSROOMS ...

PRE-SCHOOL: September has been an exciting month for our preschoolers! The preschool classes have been working to familiarize themselves with their new classrooms, classmates and school staff members. They began learning to follow class rules and routines and have enjoyed playing with their new friends. The preschoolers are looking forward to beginning a study on TREES in October! They will be exploring how trees grow and change, what grows on trees and who cares for trees. The preschoolers look forward to observing



the trees as they change outside their classrooms this fall!

KINDERGARTEN: September has been all about making new friends and learning about how to work together in the classroom. Our classroom routines are falling into place throughout each subject area. In math, we are beginning to learn all about numbers through counting and cardinality. We are beginning our "We Are Readers" unit in reading workshop and looking forward to reading words and pictures independently. In October, we are getting excited for fall activities like learning about season char-

acteristics and changes.

FIRST GRADE: First graders are learning the routines and procedures of a full day of school! They enjoy going to specials and eating lunch at school. They are learning the importance of listening from our *Second Step Program* with Ears Listening, Eyes Watching, Voice Quiet and Body Still. This is the way to be learning! First graders have their own workbooks in math and we are beginning to learn about addition and subtraction and how they are related to each other. We will be using the Splash Math program for homework at the end of the month. Students are also learning how to choose books and how to take care of them. They are working hard at being authors and illustrators in Writing Workshop. We are looking forward to going to the Reeves Arboretum in October for our first field trip!

SECOND GRADE: Things are in full swing in second grade! The students have adjusted to the routines and demands of second grade. As readers, students have been building their reading stamina, and filling their book boxes with "just right" books. As writers, students have been busy collecting ideas and memories in their lives to share with others through personal narratives. As scientists, students have been carrying out Science and Engineering Practices as they ask questions and gather information during explorations. As mathematicians, students are learning different math strategies to help them add and subtract fluently. They are beginning to rotate between differentiated math centers that will enrich the math units. In October, social scientists will begin learning about their role as good citizens within their communities, as well as how leaders of the past have helped shape communities. Second graders will also dive into our character education program, Second Step, which gives students the tools to manage social and emotional situations. In conjunction with these lessons, growth mindset lessons will be infused as well.

THIRD *GRADE*: Third Graders were eager to get back into the school routine this September, and haven't slowed down since! They have been working hard across all areas of the curriculum. As writers, students have been focusing on small moment writing and using workshop skills to write personal narratives. As readers, students have been building reading stamina, choosing a variety of books to read, and recording thoughts about books along the way. We are looking forward to delving into character studies in the near

future. After a jumpstart into our new math program, students are working on multiplication strategies. The focus of "New Jersey" in Social Studies has already taken us through map skills and community. We will soon start to research the explorers who helped to find New Jersey, as well as the American Revolution. In Science, each class has been exposed to some basic knowledge of what a scientist does. We encourage you to ask your children about the questions they are solving through the science and engineering process!



Please also remind your children that no food is to be 'shared' with anyone at school. Students should only be eating food brought from their home or ordered by their parent.

Please note, if you think your child has a fever, please check their temperature with a thermometer. If their temperature is 100 degrees or greater, please allow them some restful time at home to recuperate and get well. Your child must remain home for 24 hours after the fever has subsided without fever reducing medication.

Please enter absences in the Parent Portal or call the absentee line before 8:30am and 12:00pm for the afternoon sessions, if your child will not be coming to school or will be late.

After School Enrichment Classes start October 1st. Please remember to call the absentee line if your child will not be attending their enrolled enrichment class if they were in school earlier that day. All after school enrichment classes end at 4:05pm. Please be prompt in picking up your child.

We have been busy the month of September in Physical Education. **First grade students** are off to a great start in PE. We started out the year by doing some parachute activities. I like to begin the year with this because it requires listening, safety and cooperation. The students have done very well with safety and listening, and I would just like to remind all students that they should wear sneakers on the days they have PE.

Second and third graders started the year discussing "Sportsmanship" - what it means as a participant and how it applies to best effort, teamwork and following directions. Icebreaker games were completed to practice what good sportsmanship "looks and sounds" like during activities! The Second Grade Bike Test will be held on October 10. Students are reminded to bring their bikes and helmets to school. Students will be evaluated on bike skills and safety by Mr. Visitacion and Mr. Finken in gym classes.

Our annual Milton's Duathlon is set for Saturday, October 13, at 8:00 a.m. at Chatham Middle School (check in begins at 7:45 a.m.). Students will complete a 15 minute bike ride followed by a 10 minute run! The bike ride will be for Milton students only, but parents are encouraged to run with their child during the running portion. For the safety of all students, we will only allow bikes. The children must have a helmet, a bike (in good condition), and a water bottle. More information will be coming home next week.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN HEALTH

First Grade: Classes learned about the amazing human body and all the things it can do (i.e. fastest speed a human can run, number of teeth). Students identified actions that they do each day to be healthy; brushing their teeth, getting plenty of sleep, and following good nutrition.

Second Grade: Students have just learned about bike safety. The weather is still nice for riding bikes so it is important for students to understand the rules of the road. The students have also learned about the "Dimensions of Health." These are the 5 branches of health and wellness: Physical, Social, Emotional, Spiritual and Intellectual. The main idea of this concept is for students to realize that Health is more than just taking care of your body. Covering this concept allows students to make connections and see the big picture.

Third Grade: Third grade students began the year by reviewing the Dimensions of Health (physical, social, spiritual, emotional, intellectual). These dimensions of health allow the students to see how other things besides physical health choices can play a role in their overall health and wellness. We also learned about outdoor fire safety. In the spring, the St. Barnabas Fire Safety House visits MAS and the students will receive a presentation from a firefighter. With that in mind, the focus on the lesson we do is on campfire safety. The students learn some good rules about being safe around campfires that they can hopefully remember throughout their lives.
